



Pira cabinets

Pira generation two is a contemporary interpretation of the original Pira from 1954. The new Pira, by Anna von Schewen and Björn Dahlström, has a modular design and can be free-standing, with floor-to-ceiling tension, or wall mounted. It is equally well-suited to larger living areas as public spaces, elegant and robust at the same time with gravitas in material and dimensions. The cabinet, organisers and bookends in walnut or white oak furnish the shelves and create a warm contrast to the metal. The poles and shelves comes in white and black grey.

About the designers – Björn and Anna

Architect and designer Anna von Schewen is considered one of Sweden's most progressive and experimental designers. She has together with her partner Björn Dahlström designed several products for String Furniture. Björn Dahlström is also a well-established Swedish industrial designer. He is represented in various museums around the world, including the national Museum for Art, Architecture and Design in Oslo, The Museum of Design & Craft (The Röhsska Museum) in Gothenburg and Victoria & Albert Museum in London.

Product dimensions

W: 66,3 cm H: 41,6 cm D: 31 cm

Cabinets measuring 66,3 cm in width are suitable for shelves in 70 cm and 90 cm width.

Cabinet measuring 86,3 in width is suitable for shelves in 90 cm width.

Packaging

The cabinets are flat-packed and need to be assembled.

Materials and colors

The cabinets are made from solid wood, veneer and particleboard.

Sustainability

The cabinets are made from the renewable and recyclable material wood, both solid wood, veneer and particleboard.

Care and maintenance

Wipe the surface with a cloth. Damp wipe with detergent solution. Then rub dry with a cloth. Remove stains with detergents that do not contain abrasives. Never use steel wool.
